

- Q. All the time that you were at the Hubbard house or outside of it, did you see Kim Hubbard's car?
  - A. Yes.
  - Q. Was it always there until you left?
  - A. Yes.
  - Q. And you are sure of that?
  - A. Yes.
  - Q. You think you spent around 20 minutes with Michelle?
  - A. Yes.
  - Q. From there when you got home it was around 4:30?
  - A. Yes.
- Q. By the way, Cindy, while you were leaning against Kim's car, did you see Nike or Phil Grimes, I don't know which way you may know him, did you see him next door working on a car or anything like that?
  - A. No.
  - Q. Did you pay any attention?
  - A. No.

- Q. Of this you are sure, that you were leaning against Kim's car?
  - A. Yes.
- Q. How long did you think you were waiting for Ruthie to come out while you were leaning against Kim's car?
  - A. About ten minutes.
  - Q. Now, did you see Kim at all?
  - A. No.
  - Q. You are sure of that, aren't you?
  - A. Yes.
  - Q. You were in Ruthie's house, weren't y ou?
  - A. Yes.
  - Q. You were also outside of it, weren't you?
  - A. Yes.
- Q. And all during the time you were there you did not see Kim?
  - A. Yes ... I mean no.
